

AB 1953 (Maienschein) Expand Use of Refillable Water Bottle Stations in Public Areas: This bill will mandate refillable water bottle stations in public areas like transit stations and publicly owned buildings.

AB 1985 (R. Rivas) - Organics Procurement: As written, the bill will require CalRecycle to create a list of projects that a local government can use to meet the procurement requirements of SB 1383.

SB 1256 (Wieckowski) – Single-use propane canisters: Prohibits the sale of disposable 1 lb propane canisters since refillable options have become readily available.

AB 1690 (Luz Rivas) Reduce single-use smoking product waste: Would prohibit the sale of single-use vapes, cigarette filters, and plastic cigar filters.

AB 2026 (Friedman) Shift to sustainable e-commerce packaging: Will require a shift to e-commerce packaging that is either reusable or recyclable/compostable and accepted in curbside bins by phasing out certain single-use plastic packaging including plastic mailing envelopes, bubble wrap, air pillows, and expanded polystyrene.

AB 2779 (Irwin) Bottle Bill, wine and distilled spirits: This bill would expand the state’s Beverage Container Recycling Program (Bottle Bill) to include wine and distilled spirits sold in aluminum beverage containers.

AB 2784 (Ting) – Thermoform plastic minimum recycled content standards: Would require thermoform plastic containers to contain specified amounts of postconsumer thermoform recycled plastic.

SB 38 (Wieckowski) - Industry-run bottle recycling program: This bill would eliminate the current Beverage Container Recycling Program and require beverage distributors to create a new bottle and can recycling program by 2024. It calls for a Beverage Container Stewardship Organization to form and create a new stewardship plan.

SB 54 (Allen) - Plastic Pollution Producer Responsibility Act: Establishes the Plastic Pollution Producer Responsibility Act, which would prohibit producers of single-use, disposable packaging or single-use, disposable food service ware products from selling packaging or products in the state unless they are recyclable or compostable.

AB 1454 (Bloom) - Bottle Bill Reform: This bill would update the state’s Beverage Container Recycling Program (Bottle Bill), while re-investing unredeemed funds. AB 1454’s core provision would increase payments to recycling centers to better reflect the actual cost of recycling. It would also increase payments to rural recycling center to cover their higher transportation costs. AB 1454 contains several provisions to entice new recycling opportunities to open, including start-up loans and handling fee eligibility anywhere in an unserved zone for the first recycler to open there.

CEMEX EMSW Kiln 2- Apple Valley, CA- Engineered Municipal Solid Waste Conversion Facility- A new permit application packet was submitted to the LEA for review. Currently Under Review.

Agromin OC Ontario Green Material Composting – EA Notification- A new EAN was submitted to the LEA to update their operation. Completed February 17, 2022

Victor Valley Material Recovery Facility and Transfer Station- Victorville, CA- Large Volume Transfer/Processing Facility- A Solid Waste Facility Permit Revision Application and Transfer Processing Report were submitted to the LEA. Request Withdrawn.

Landers Sanitary Landfill – A 5 Year Permit Review Application has been submitted. Completed January 27, 2022.

City of Claremont Community Services Department- Claremont, CA- Medium Volume Transfer Processing Facility- A registration permit application package was submitted to the LEA for Review. Registration Permit issued. Completed December 13, 2021.

Camp Rock Transfer Station - A 5 Year Permit Review Application packet has been submitted. Completed December 16, 2021

Fort Irwin Sanitary Landfill- Fort Irwin, CA- Class III Disposal Facility- A 5 Year Permit Review Application was submitted. Completed December 10, 2021.
