IX. Legislation Update: Presented by Linda Ceballos

2 Year Bills

SB707 - Responsible Textile Recovery Act of 2023

Establishes the Responsible Textile Recovery Act of 2024, which mandates the formation of a Producer Responsibility Organization that manages the collection,

transportation, sorting, and repair of textiles and apparel. *Approved by governor* 9/28/24.

AB660 - Food and beverage products: labeling: quality dates, safety dates, and sell by dates: recycling.

Bans "sell-by" dates and standardizes date labels across brands by requiring all manufacturers to only use "Best if Used By" to indicate quality and "Use By" to indicate safety. Confusion over expiration dates leads to 20% of all consumer food waste, and reforming dates has been identified as the single most cost-effective strategy for reducing food waste. *Approved by governor 9/28/24.*

AB863 - Carpet recycling: carpet stewardship organizations: fines: succession: training.

Makes changes to the CARE carpet recycling program, including increasing fines, adding CA stakeholders to the CARE board, setting a closed loop recycling target and allocating 8% of the funds collected for workplace apprenticeship programs, among other changes. *Approved by governor 9/27/24.*

Organics

AB2346 - Organic waste reduction regulations: procurement of recovered organic waste products.

Provides additional tools and pathways for local jurisdictions to meet their SB 1383 procurement requirements, including through the use of individual/regional procurement targets tied to waste characterization data and the addition of edible food recovery and community compost, among other changes. *Approved by governor 9/27/24*.

AB2902 - Organic Waste: reduction regulations: exemptions.

Addresses rural jurisdictions' issues with implementation of SB 1383, including extending existing rural waivers, allowing some alternate compliance strategies for low-population jurisdictions, among other changes. *Approved by governor 9/22/24.*

Recyclable Materials and Plastics Reduction

SB1053 - Solid waste: reusable grocery bags: standards: plastic film prohibition. Closes the plastic bag ban loophole by banning the thicker so-called 'reusable' plastic bags at checkout. No plastic bags will be allowed whatsoever, and 50% PCR paper bags will be available for purchase. *Approved by governor 9/22/24*.

Product Stewardship and Extended Producer Responsibility SB1143 – Paint products: stewardship program

Expands the existing PaintCare Program to include additional paint products. Earlier versions of the bill would have created an HHW EPR program. *Approved by governor* 9/29/24.

Hazardous Waste and Illegal Dumping

SB1280 - Waste Management: propane cylinders: reusable or refillableThis bill would prohibit the sale or offer for sale of propane cylinders other than those propane cylinders that are reusable or refillable beginning 2028. *Approved by governor 9/22/24.*

Miscellaneous Solid Waste and Recycling AB2632 - Planning and zoning: thrift retail stores

The bill would prohibit a city, including a charter city, a county, or a city and county, from prohibiting a thrift retail store from receiving used and donated items for sale in the store or other thrift retail stores, or reuse or recycling, or both reuse and recycling, through other means. This bill would prohibit a city, charter city, a county, or a city and county, from treating a thrift retail store differently from a non-thrift retail store for purposes of zoning, development standards, or permitting; and would allow such jurisdictions to require that thrift retail stores meet certain aesthetic or design standards, as prescribed. *Approved by governor 9/27/24.*
