

Safety Checklist:

- Ensure each participant has viewed the online safety presentation in advance of events.
- Review safety procedures before each work event.
- Park all vehicles where they do not interfere with pedestrians or traffic .
- Proceed in the direction facing traffic and watch oncoming traffic. Post a safety lookout when you are unable to watch oncoming traffic.
- Do not work on slippery ground, on slopes greater than approximately 40°, on bridges, in tunnels, or inside culverts.
- Wear safety gear at all times while in the right of way.
- Wear long pants, gloves, hard-soled shoes or boots with ankle support.
- Use Roadside Cleanup bags provided by the Department. Place bags at a few feet from the edge of the traffic lanes and off the paved shoulders. Place bags in locations where they are not obstructing drainage and where Department Maintenance staff can easily see and safely retrieve them. Stack bags together and 100 feet from structures (if possible).
- Be very careful when handling any sharp objects. Do not handle “Sharps” (i.e.: needles). Report such findings to your Road Department contact.

What items to bag:

Small to medium sized items made of:

- Paper
- Cardboard
- Plastic
- Styrofoam
- Wood
- Rubber
- Glass
- Metal

Don't forget to collect and redeem recyclable items. Just take them to a local recycle station.

Please don't bag:

- Items with sharp edges.
- Large items too big for a bag.
- Heavy items that could tear a bag.
- Containers that are not empty.

REPORT

To the San Bernardino County Department of Public Works Radio Room at 909-387-8063:

- Sharp, large, or heavy items.
- Any item in an unsafe location.
- Location of filled trash bags.
- Hazardous substances.

To the San Bernardino County Sheriff at 909-387-8313:

- Crime-scene evidence.

- Anything that poses an immediate threat.
